This book describes ongoing developments in social media within the tourism and hospitality sector, highlighting impacts on both the demand and the supply side. It offers a combination of theory and practice, with discussion of real-life business experiences. The book is divided into three parts, the first of which provides an overview of recent trends in social media and user-generated content, clarifies concepts that are often used in an overlapping way and examines the "digitization of word of mouth" via online networks. The second part analyzes the impacts that social

media can have on traveler behavior for each step in the travel process and also on suppliers, highlighting opportunities, threats and strategies. In the third part of the book, future potential trends deriving from the mobile marketing technologies are explored and possible methods for social monitoring by means of key performance indicators are examined. It is considered how engaging customers and prospects by means of social media might increase customer loyalty, foster electronic word-of-mouth communication, and consequently have important effects on corporate sales and revenues. The discussion encompasses methods to measure company performance on each of the social media in order to understand the optimal mix that will support and improve business strategies.

The novel *Ruta Tannenbaum* is by prolific, award-winning

Croatian author Miljenko Jergović. First published in 2006, the story illuminates life and society in Yugoslavia between the world wars. The title character was inspired by real-life figure Lea Deutsch, the now-forgotten Shirley Temple of Yugoslavia, who was murdered in the Holocaust. Using their shared Jewish heritage as a starting point, Jergovic constructs a fictional family history populated by historical figures with the precocious Ruta at the center. Stephen Dickey's translation masterfully captures Jergovic's colloquial yet deeply observed style, which animates the tangled and troubled history of persecution and war in Croatia.

Najpoznatija Krlezina zbirka novela Hrvatski bog Mars dio je

zamisljenog ciklusa književnih djela s temom Prvog svjetskog rata i hrvatskih domobrana. Krleža je izvorno pod ovim naslovom namjeravao napisati "domobranski historički roman u četiri dela", što je prvi put najavio u časopisu Plamen 1919. godine. Međutim, takav roman nikada nije napisao. Od 1922. godine objavljuje različito koncipirane knjige s ovim naslovom, a za konačno i kanonsko izdanje smatra se ono iz 1946. godine, u kojemu je autor dodao i opširni "Tumac domobranskih i stranih rijeci i pojmova". Konačna redakcija sadrži šest novela, te ekspresionističku alegoriju Hrvatska rapsodija (prvi put objavljena u časopisu Savremenik 1917. godine), koju je teško zanrovski odrediti, jer je riječ o djelu koje ima karakteristike novele i drame. Dio ciklusa je i drama Galicija koju je Krleža napisao neposredno nakon rata (kasnije je znatno preradena u novu dramu s naslovom U logoru), koja nije uvrštena u ovu zbirku.

Although its early films featured racial caricatures and exclusively Caucasian heroines, Disney has, in recent years, become more multicultural in its filmic fare and its image. From Aladdin and Pocahontas to the Asian American boy Russell in *Up*, from the first African American princess in *The Princess and the Frog* to "Spanish-mode" Buzz Lightyear in *Toy Story 3*, Disney films have come to both mirror and influence our increasingly diverse society. This essay collection gathers recent scholarship on representations of diversity in Disney and Disney/Pixar films, not only exploring race and gender, but also drawing on perspectives from newer areas of study, particularly sexuality/queer studies, critical whiteness studies, masculinity studies and disability studies. Covering a wide array of films, from Disney's early days
