Learning Chinese can be  
frustrating and difficult,

partly because it's very different from European languages. Following a teacher, textbook or language course is not enough. It's like when someone on TV teaches you how to cook: you won't get to eat the delicious dish just by watching the program; you have to do the cooking yourself. That's true for this book as well. When you apply what you learn, it will boost your learning, making every hour you spend count for more, but you still have to
