Vidaković and gathered primarily at the Beogradske Opštinske Novine (Belgrade City Newspaper). Some of the proposals are general, but often they present very concrete ideas on how to overcome the difficult

housing situation of the poor in Belgrade between the wars. The texts analyzed were written for the most part during the 1930s. They were backed up by detailed investigations of the wretched housing situation and often by experience from other European cities in resolving their housing problems. The authors of these proposals and critiques had different

affiliations, educational backgrounds and professions, and thus their views of apartments for the poor varied. Nevertheless, there was a common understanding among this group of authors that only deep-seated social reforms and quick action could raise the living and housing standards of Belgrade's general population, including the poor. In order to understand the

significance of this intellectual heritage, the reader needs to know the reality of Belgrade's housing situation between the two world wars. The book, therefore, presents the apartments, houses, residential buildings and parts of Belgrade where the poor lived to describe the conditions and forms of their housing between the two world wars. The book analyzes

the urban context of Belgrade at the time, presents the social structure of society and the heterogeneous structure of the poor that made up almost four-fifths of the total city population.

Casting doubt on such fashionable terms as dictatorship, autocracy, fascism, and authoritarianism, Keane makes a case for retrieving and refurbishing the old term “despotism” to make sense of how these regimes function and endure. He shows how they cooperate regionally and globally and draw strength from each other’s resources while breeding global anxieties and threatening the values and institutions of democracy.
